Itinerary & Cost

Dates: June 2-30, 2025

Total cost of trip will be \$4,000 **includes airfare, insurance, daily meals, lodging and one excursion (island retreat or visiting the ruins)

We will arrive in Honduras on June 2, 2025. We will eat lunch after leaving the airport and receive orientation when we arrive. You will be shown to your room and settle in prior to supper and devotional.

Weekly schedules will vary between time in the clinic, hospital and villages.

There will be opportunity to eat at restaurants when traveling and buying souvenirs. You will need to have money to cover these outings. \$200-\$300 would be a good consideration for these costs.

MISSION PACKET 3

What to Bring

For Travel: Wear something comfortable with pockets to keep up with your passport and other important documentation and belongings. Inform yourselves on COVID requirements and luggage regulations. As of now, there are no COVID requirements.

For Working: Expect to get dirty at times! There is laundry service. Closed-toe shoes, work gloves, and a shade hat are beneficial. Sunscreen is important as this is an equatorial region. Daily temperatures will range between mid 50's and mid 80's. We will be 700'-4000' above sea level, so mosquitoes (and associated diseases) are not a huge problem, but bug spray is still a good thing to have on hand. We may experience precipitation, so a cheap pancho or other light rain jacket will suffice but is not necessary. A water bottle, however, is an absolute must.

Whatever technology devices are useful to you (phone, tablet, computer). We have great wifi on the property.

For Play: We will walk around town and spend a lot of time on our feet. If we visit the children's home, you will play with the kids, paint nails, play soccer, color, hygiene classes, etc.

For Spending/Giving: Snacks and water are available at the compound and locally. There is ATM service in Ojojona and Tegucigalpa if you need access to more money at any time.
